The British Broadcasting Corporation (BBC) is the publicly funded media service of the United Kingdom funded by public subscription in the form of a License Fee and license payers paid £2,658 million in the financial year 2002-2003 making the BBC the most extensive and best funded Public Service Broadcaster in the world.

The BBC's aim is to enrich people's lives with great programmes and services that inform, educate and entertain. It broadcasts radio and television programmes on analogue and digital services in the UK. It delivers interactive services across the web, television and mobile devices. The BBC's online service is Europe's most widely visited content site. Across the world, the BBC broadcasts radio programmes in 43 languages on the BBC World Service and the 24-hour television service, BBC World.

The BBC Weather Centre is a 24/7 operation responsible for all weather output on any BBC service. It currently produces over 120 TV and Radio Broadcasts per day from 2 dedicated TV studios and 1 Radio Studio. The Centre also feeds the BBC's Internet and Teletext services.
